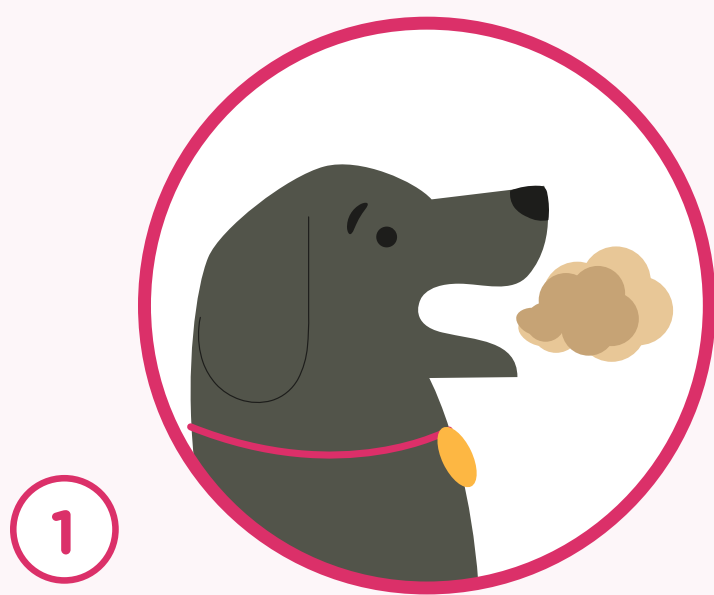

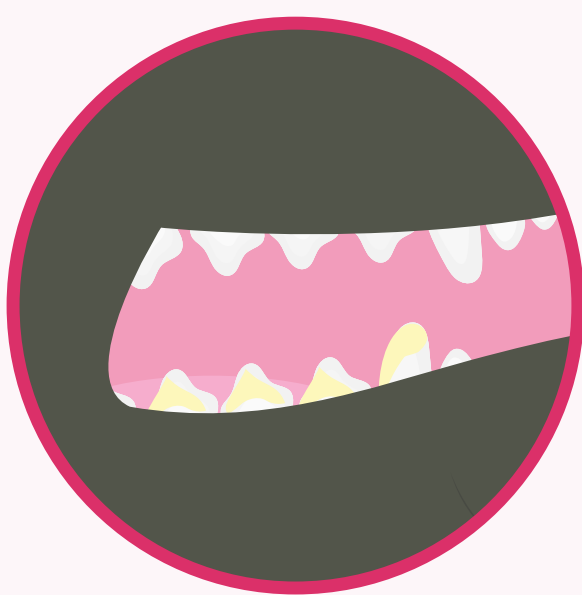

## Bad breath

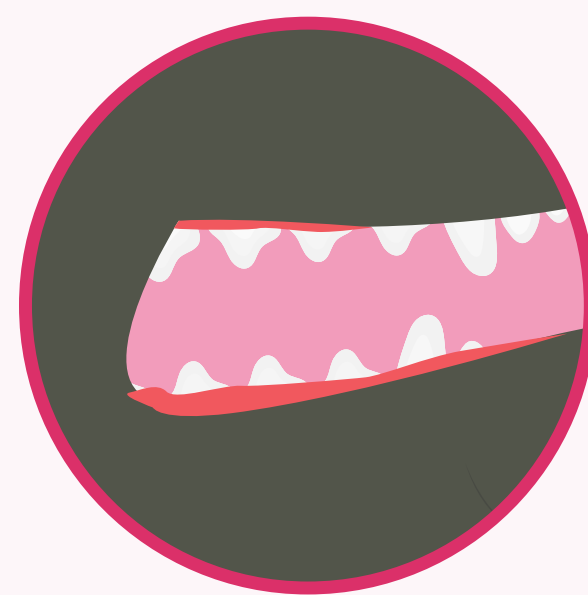
Foul odour from your dog's mouth can mean bacterial buildup or dental disease

## Tartar & plaque buildup

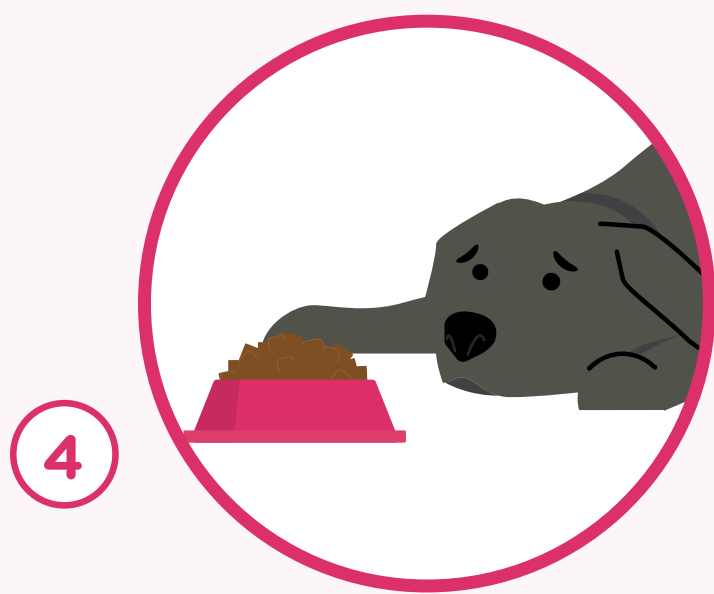
Yellow or brown tartar and plaque on teeth suggest your dog needs a dental check

## Difficulty eating

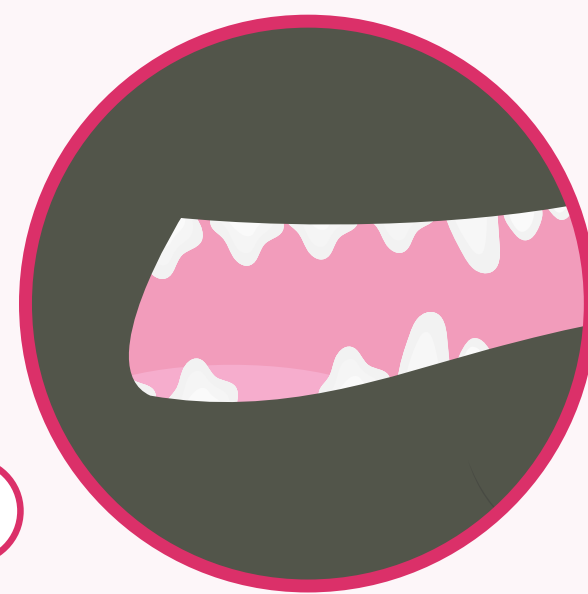
Trouble chewing or avoiding food might be due to dental pain

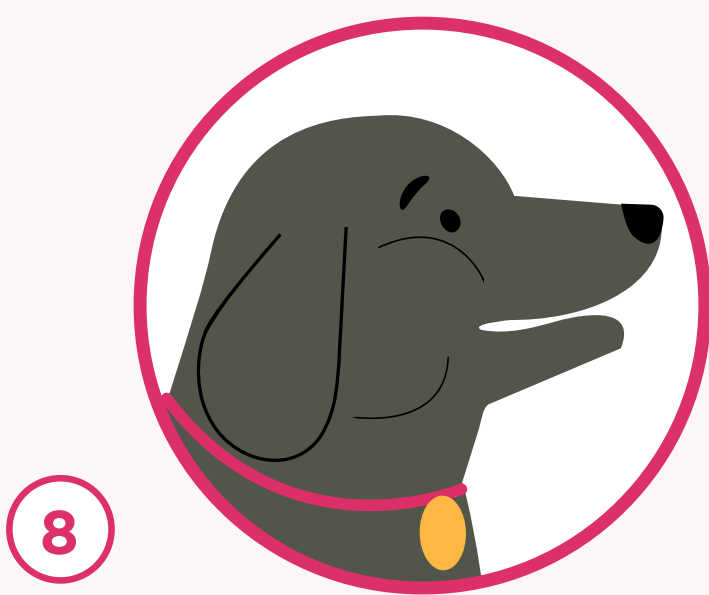

## Bleeding from the mouth

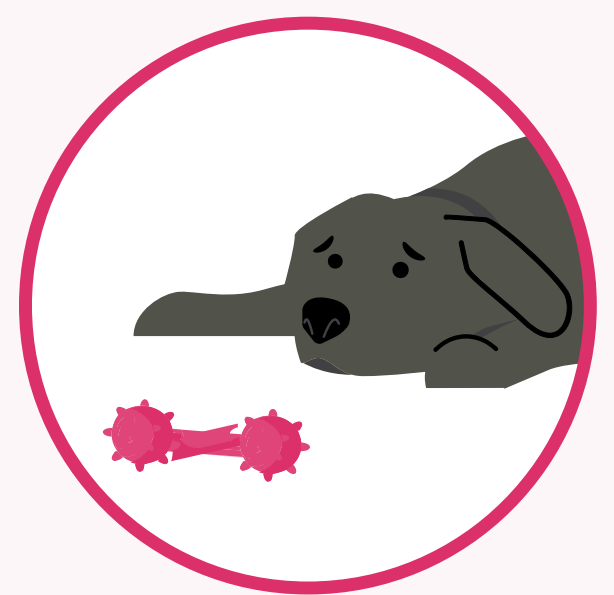
Blood in saliva or around the mouth can indicate gum disease
