Step-by-step guide to dental treatment in pets

Pre-op

- Consultation
 - Vet recommends dental treatment
 - Procedure booked with practice
 - Food withheld beforehand (not applicable to rabbits)



- Pet brought to practice on procedure day
- Weighed, health checked by vet/nurse
- Consent form signed by owners



- Pre-anaesthetic blood tests done
- IV line placed if needed
- Pet settled into kennel



Procedure

General anaesthetic

- Pet given injection to make them sleep
- Anaesthetic gas administered to keep pet asleep
- Vital signs monitored



- Teeth and gums checked, dental chart created
- Dental x-rays taken to check roots
- Teeth needing extraction identified

Extractions (if needed)

- Loose, broken, retained or rotten teeth removed
- In rabbits, overgrown teeth filed or extracted

Scaling and polishing

- Tartar/plaque removed
- Teeth polished to smooth surface

Waking Up

- Anaesthetic gas turned off
- Pet wakes up slowly
- Offered food once fully awake







Post-op

Update owners

- Owners updated on findings and procedure
- Discharge time arranged

Home time

- Owners pick up pet at prearranged time
- Post-op care instructions provided
- Recheck appointment scheduled

Recheck

- Pet rechecked in coming days/weeks
- Discuss ways to prevent future problems
